Oral PPT presentation: 4-6 minutes	Students interview one or more people of a different generation than their own about some aspect of life (e.g. use of technology, entertainment, education or an area of interest to the student). In an oral presentation, the students then reflect on, and evaluate the interview and the processes used and answer questions. Due: Thursday (week 6)		comments. Written report 500 words	Students conduct research on a topic related to the interview (e.g. technology in earlier times). They make notes while undertaking the research and then produce a written presentation based on the research. Students negotiate the topic and type of written presentation with the teacher. Due: Friday 7 th June (week 6)	Written report 500 words	 Students complete an extended written response to an aspect of the issue analysis. They: report on an aspect of the issue that was the focus of study comment on the processes they used for the issue analysis, including a brief evaluation of the relevance of sources, the process used to determine the topic, or findings that were interesting or unexpected.
